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

Making A Strong Password

Not all passwords are created equal. When it comes to making a strong password, you must think about it. If you use a password you can't remember, then it's essentially useless. Quick Tech Productivity Pointers

In this month's edition, we continue with the tips to help optimize your Windows 11 system:

Let's get back to **SETTINGS** > **Privacy & security** > **Activity history**. If you wish to have Windows track all of your activity and make it readily available to you (beyond one session), then leave this checked; however, if you prefer to maintain your privacy, you might like to disable the option, "Store my activity

history on this device." This will prevent Microsoft from using your history to personalize your experience. Should you want to remove whatever has been recorded, go to the Clear activity history and click on the "Clear" button. This will not only prevent the storing, but will remove what might have already been stored on your machine.

Aside from your activity, Windows may give permission to your installed applications to reveal your location. As you may imagine, this may be okay to use for a Weather app, but you might not want it to be enabled for Facebook or another Social Media app inasmuch as it will reveal your location (especially, if you are out-of-town on vacation) and you don't wish to share that information with the World. This info is found under **Privacy & security** >

Location. You can turn off *Location services* entirely or selectively based on *apps access*. Take a look and try to envision *how* this may affect you as you review the apps and consider their implementation of your location. What can it reveal and how may it be exploited by a bad actor?

The next extension of thought then assesses the integrity of the apps you install on your machine relative to the source you download them from. If you visit **SETTINGS** > **Apps** > **Apps & features**, you may determine where

you will allow your system to download apps from. Choose where to get apps:

- * Anywhere (default option)
- * Anywhere, but let me know if there's a comparable app in the Microsoft Store
- * Anywhere, but warn me before installing an app that's not from the Microsoft Store
- * The Microsoft Store only (Recommended) Now that you see what they are, can you figure out why you are being prompted? Again, refer to the question shown earlier regarding bad actors. What is your extension of thought?
- When you examine the next prompt, you are asked if and how to Share across devices. If you choose $\left[\mathbf{OFF} \right]$ to share across , then NO SHARING WILL OCCUR, but if you select one of the other two, your apps may be shared with My devices only or with Everyone nearby. The options are self-explanatory.
- Two of the most powerful sections are the **Apps List** (formerly *Programs & Features*). This is where you may see all of the programs installed on your computer. Each entry will have the application's name, version, company name and the date of last install/update. If you no longer want the application on your computer, simply click on the three vertical dots (:) to either *modify* [if available] or Uninstall. Again, a straightforward option.
- The last we'll cover here is **Apps** > **Startup.** Apps can be configured to start when you log in. In most cases, apps will start minimized or may only start a background task. You choose if it's **OFF** • or **ON** • • Sort by Name, Status or Startup Impact (how much it slows the machine down at startup). Judge which you need and disable those you done use. Here are ways to optimize Windows 11, so go for it!
