Create Guidelines

Electronic devices like smartphones, tablets and video game consoles can be fun for kids, but can also be distracting. You shouldn't want your children to be on screens all day, as it can damage their mental health. There's no one-size-fits-all approach to screen time, so you must determine what works best for your situation.

The American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry reports, on average, children ages 8 to 12 in the United States spend four to six hours a day watching or using screens,

and teens spend up to nine hours. Getting your kids to use their screens less can be difficult if they're already watching for multiple hours a day, but it's necessary in helping their development. Set specific hours they can use their screens for personal use or make them log the time when using their devices. If you're worried they won't be honest about their screen use, create a rule that they can only use the devices in public areas of the house, not their room. Put guidelines in place as soon as possible. If you wait until school starts, you will be looking at an argument and further disruption to their studies.

Monitor What They're Doing And Set Website Restrictions

Does your child do their homework on a computer? If so, how do you know they're actually working on their homework? Keep a watchful eye on your children when they're using their devices to ensure they're using them properly. They may trick you to get a few more minutes of screen time. Continually check on them while they're using a screen to do their homework, and don't be afraid to take a closer look.

You should also look into setting up website restrictions on your network. You don't want your child stumbling upon an inappropriate website, and you don't want them on an unsecured website that could put your network and personal information at risk. Set up website restrictions through your network and

each device to ensure your child doesn't go where they shouldn't be.

Talk With Them About The Dangers Of Social Media

If your child doesn't already have one, at some point they will create a social media account so they can stay up-to-date with everything going on with their friends and family. Social media can be harmless when used cautiously; you must explain that to your children. Let them know other people can see everything they post, so they need to think carefully before posting anything, especially pictures.

As a best practice, turn off all social media applications' geolocation and messaging features. That way, your child won't receive message requests from strangers or inform strangers of their location.

If you have a social media account, you should also be cautious about your posts. Your child will look at your account for direction, and if you post questionable content, there will be some confusion. It might even cause them to ignore your rules.

The start of a new school year is an exciting time in your child's life. You can help set them up for even greater success by implementing a few tech strategies to help them focus and stay out of trouble!

Always maintain an active subscription to an Antivirus/Endpoint Protection on your PCs. It is the easiest basic way to protect yourself when active online. 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

Have you ever created a Powerpoint Presentation? "Dr. Phil" used to ask, "And so how's that workin' for you?" Were you able to communicate and impress those in your audience or were you a cure for insomnia?

Don't over do it. When you make a Powerpoint, one of the first rules is not to go overboard with creativity. Too many presenters end up creating the equivalent of "ransom notes"—their slides look like cut out letters from a newspaper pasted on a page to mask the person's identity. Do your slides look like this?

Here is A sample of MY Powerpoint presentation

Stick to the basics. Select a stock theme with consistent fonts, formatting and colors or don't do it. Giving a presentation is your chance to make a positive impression that engages your audience and entertains them or educates them. It should not bore them to death. We refer to the template as a **theme** or **design**. Some are busy and others are simple, but they are all consistently laid out to



give you a standard. Above are a few that are provided with the application. Select any one and you may begin your work. Keep in mind, you want to deliver value when you present. If the slides

are too difficult to read, busy, cluttered or you have too many concepts in a single slide, your audience will become distracted or overwhelmed.

Use a structured approach. Prior to composing the actual presentation, work on an outline. Start with main ideas and expand them into subtopics. If you have created a valid framework, your design and concepts will naturally flow from one into the next. By the time you reach the end, you will have met your objective in explaining your topic in an orderly and concise manner.

Engage without overwhelming. As you refine your talk, you may wish to liven it up with smooth transitions from slide to slide. Be careful not to over use the transition effect or apply too many animations. This should coordinate with your words as you give your speech, but should not be so distracting your audience sees your talk as a game where they try to anticipate from which side a transition will appear or how the letters will be animated along with any images you present.

Be mindful of your captive audience. No one wants to feel trapped when being presented to. With that thought, do your best to keep the talk as brief as possible without too many omissions. Size it right and you will have won them over and made your point. Do your best to be empathetic with the people in the seats. They want to hear what you have to say, but do not wish to have a bad experience sitting through *Powerpoint hell*. Give them a story to relate to and make it a memorable time for all. We hope you find these pointers to be beneficial.
