## Be Careful When Scanning QR Codes

QR codes are everywhere these days. You can find them on restaurant menus, flyers, and posters. They’re used both offline and online. QR codes are convenient and easy to use. You just scan them with your smartphone camera. You’re then directed to a link, a coupon, a video, or some other online content.

With the rise in popularity of QR codes comes an unfortunate dark side. Cybercriminals are exploiting this technology for nefarious purposes. Scammers create fake QR codes. They can steal your personal information. They can also infect your device with malware or trick you into paying money.

It’s crucial to exercise caution when scanning QR codes. This emerging scam highlights the potential dangers lurking behind those seemingly innocent squares.

**The QR Code Resurgence**

QR codes were originally designed for tracking parts in the automotive industry. They have experienced a renaissance in recent years as a result; they’re used as a form of marketing today.

They offer the convenience of instant access to information. You simply scan a code. Unfortunately, cybercriminals are quick to adapt. A new phishing scam has emerged, exploiting the trust we place in QR codes.

**How the Scam Works**

The scammer prints out a fake QR code. They place it over a legitimate one. For example, they might stick it on a poster that advertises a product discount or a movie.

You come along and scan the fake QR code, thinking it’s legitimate. The fake code may direct you to a phishing website. These sites

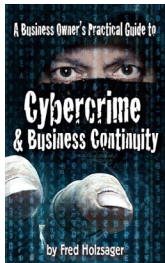

may ask you to enter sensitive data such as your credit card details, login credentials, or other personal information.

Upon scanning, the QR code may prompt you to download a malicious app—One that contains malware and can do one or more of the following:

- ◆ Spy on your activity
- ◆ Access your copy/paste history
- ◆ Access your contacts
- ◆ Lock your device until you pay a ransom

The code could also direct you to a payment page, a page that charges you a fee for something supposedly free.

*Here are some tactics to watch out for:*

### Malicious Codes Concealed

Cybercriminals tamper with legitimate QR codes. They often add a fake QR code sticker over a real one. They embed malicious content or redirect users to fraudulent websites.

### Fake Promotions and Contests

Scammers often use QR codes to lure users into fake promotions or contests. When users scan the code, it may direct them to a counterfeit website.

### Malware Distribution

Some malicious QR codes start downloads of malware onto the user's device.

### STAY VIGILANT: TIPS FOR SAFE QR CODE SCANNING

#### Verify the Source

Verify the legitimacy of the code and its source.

**Upon scanning, the QR code may prompt you to download a malicious app.**

### Use a QR Code Scanner App

Use a dedicated QR code scanner app rather than the default camera app on your device. It may provide you with insights before clicking.

### Inspect the URL Before Clicking

Before visiting a website prompted by a QR code, review the URL.

### Avoid Scanning Suspicious Codes

Trust your instincts. If a QR code looks suspicious, refrain from scanning it. Your intuition is your best friend in the world of cyberspace. When your "Spider Sense" acts up, Listen!

### Update Your Device and Apps

Keep your device's operating system and QR code scanning apps up to date.

### Be Wary of Websites Accessed via QR Code

Don't enter any personal information on a website that you accessed through a QR code. This includes things like your address, credit card details, login information, etc. Don't pay any money or make any donations through a QR code.

Hopefully, this will give you some awareness to give you a fighting chance the next time you are tempted to click on any QR code.

**QUICK SECURITY TIP:** Over time, you can reduce inbound spam and junkmail. **Here's how:** When a message arrives in your Outlook inbox, if it is unsolicited, unwanted, or offensive and you do not want to hear from the sender anymore, right click on the email message, select "Junk >", then you may choose to "Block Sender" or choose from your "Junk E-mail Options..." If you choose the last option entry, you may then enter in multiple email addresses and domains of those that you no longer wish to hear from. Another way to reduce your SPAM is to use a cloud-based service that quarantines "bad" emails before they reach your mailbox, thus reducing spam and viruses in your Inbox. ☺

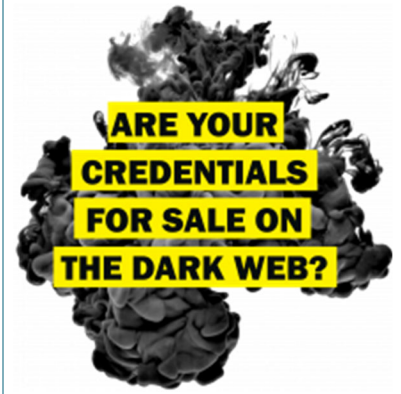

## Quick Productivity Tips

When it was initially introduced, Windows 11 did not make browser substitutions easy, but after the user community spoke up, the change was introduced. Below, we will show you how to make a change from Microsoft Edge to the browser of your choosing.

Step #1 is to open Windows 11 settings menu:

1. Click on the start icon in the taskbar (☰).
2. Select Settings from your pinned apps (Alternatively, press **Windows + I**)



3. In the Settings Menu, select **Apps**.
4. Under the Apps menu, select "Default apps".
5. In the list of apps, scroll down or search for the app you wish to use for your browser (e.g., "Google Chrome" or "Firefox").

**NOTE:** If you have never installed the browser you wish to use, it needs to be installed first.

6. Your choice will appear at the top of the column [... > Google Chrome], you may select the file extension you wish to associate with the choice app (e.g., ".pdf" or ".html") in a one off basis \* or simply select the box at the top which displays: "Make <selected browser app> your default browser [Set default]" to apply the change to all extensions normally affiliated with this type of application.

\* Should you decide to select the items on a one off method, each time you go to click on the extension, you will be presented with a

menu that resembles the one shown at right. Simply click on the application of your choice and click on "Set default."

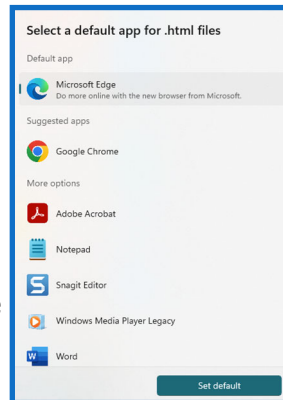
After you have set all of your selections, please be sure to review your choices when done. You should do the

same thing if you choose the "Set default" button, as well. For example, you might not wish to have Chrome display files with a **.PDF** extension, but use *Adobe Acrobat*. I am not aware of a "reset" option, so be slow and steady as you go through your choices and make changes. It's the right time to remember the adage: "Measure twice, cut once."

### Additional Insight:

If you require **Internet Explorer**, there are two options: (**IE is no longer supported [10/23] by Microsoft**—some vendors may still require it for some of their services to function.)

1. Use Microsoft Edge in "IE Mode."
2. Download the extension for your browser to run "IE Tab" (from Blackfish Software). "IE Tab" is a third party app, is not by Microsoft and should be reviewed by your tech support provider prior to installing it.
