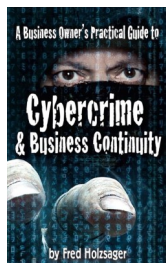

How Ransomware Works

Ransomware goes by a pretty basic pattern:

1. It infects your computer, normally through an e-mail or download.
2. It encrypts your files. This means it locks them with a secret code.
3. It displays a message. The message requests money to decrypt your files.
4. You may be provided with a key to unlock the files if you pay. In other cases, the attackers just abscond with your money.

Types of Ransomware

There are primarily two types of ransomware:

1. **Locker ransomware:** This locks the whole computer.
2. **Crypto ransomware:** This only encrypts your files.

Do Malware and Ransomware Differ?

Goals

- **Malware:** Harms your computer, steals data, or uses your computer for attacks.
- **Ransomware:** Locks your files and demands payment.

Methods

- **Malware:** Works in secret. You might not know it's there.
- **Ransomware:** Shows up. It needs to make its presence known on your computer and demands money for its removal.

Effects

- **Malware:** There are several different effects malware can have on your computer.
- **Ransomware:** Computer or important files are always locked.

How Does It Get onto Your Computer?

Malware is a general term that means "malicious software."

Common Entry Points

- Through email attachments
- Via phony websites
- Via a USB drive with an infection
- From using outdated software

How Can You Protect Yourself?

Keep your software up to date

- Use strong passwords
- Don't click on strange links or attachments
- Backup your files regularly

Quick Productivity Tips

In the current release of **Windows 11**, security has taken a major role in its implementation. Did you notice when you started with your configuration of the machine, you had no option to login without a password? Everyone must have a password to login. This prevents unauthorized users from going onto your machine so easily—think of it as a bump in the road for hackers.

As in Windows 10, you also have other **Sign-in options** you can use to login to the machine which are secure as well; however, they tend to use varied methods for you to access the machine --Microsoft named these options "Windows Hello":

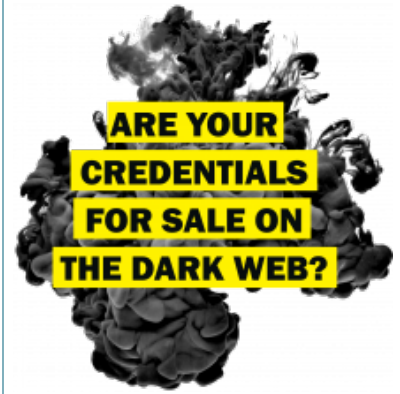
1. **Fingerprint recognition**—if your administrator has not disabled this feature, depending on the machine you use (if it has the fingerprint reader built-in), you may select that option. Windows will have you touch a certain button from different angles with specific fingers. After you set this up, all you need to do is touch the button and you are in!
2. **Facial recognition**—this feature records certain points on your face and maps them in order to recognize you. If you do the scan with your eyes open, then you must always use it with your eyes open. The angle of the image capture of your face may also be critical. If you cannot gain access with facial or finger-print, then you may need to revert to using your password.
3. If you want to make your access simpler than your password that requires a minimum of 10 to 12 letters, numbers and characters, then you might want to implement a **PIN**. PIN stands for **Personal Identification Number**. The options for your Windows Hello PIN include using a number

with 4 to 8 digits. If you enable letters and symbols, you should use at least 12 of mixed upper/lower case, numbers and symbols to keep it complex, but memorable. You will use it every day. When you setup a PIN, you will likely be prompted for your PIN at every subsequent login, not your password.

4. The fourth method, albeit not part of Windows Hello, is **using a security key**. A security key is a physical electronic "key" that is commonly inserted into the USB port on the computer. Unless you were issued one for greater security, it is unlikely that you will be using one.

All of the Sign-In options are located in Settings > Accounts > Sign-in options. Windows 11 offers you "Additional Settings" on the same page [below the options]. All contribute to your system's security. They include **"If you've been away, when should Windows require you to sign in again?"** The default is "When PC wakes up from sleep," but it may be after a screen lock or other conditions. **Dynamic Lock** automatically locks your device when you're away. This is a configuration that works using Bluetooth on your PC and on your smartphone to detect your absence.

Automatically save my restartable apps and restart them when I sign back in is a setting of On or Off. If you were working in a special app that is in your system's Startup (under Settings > Apps), then you may be in luck. It is commonly set to OFF. Show account details such as my email address on the sign-in screen—typically set to OFF. The last option is typically set to **ON** for **Use my sign-in info to automatically finish setting up after an update**. I hope these help you at work.
